Two RCTs published in 1997 formed the basis of the standard of care treatment of acute stroke patients with aspirin for secondary stroke prevention, the International Stroke Trial (IST) and the Chinese Acute Stroke Trial (CAST).^{104 105} Both studies randomized patients as soon as possible after onset (within 48 hours for CAST) to aspirin (162 mg and 300 mg, respectively) or placebo. A stroke is a serious life-threatening medical condition that happens when the blood supply to part of the brain is cut off. Strokes are a medical emergency and urgent treatment is essential. The sooner a person receives treatment for a stroke, the less damage is likely to happen. If you suspect that you or someone else is having a stroke, phone 999 immediately and ask for an ambulance.

3.74. There is strong evidence that hyper acute interventions such as brain scanning and thrombolysis are best delivered as part of a networked 24/7 service . Areas that have centralised hyper-acute stroke care into a smaller number of well-equipped and staffed hospitals have seen the greatest improvements . This means a reduction in the number of stroke-receiving units, and an increase in the number of patients receiving high-quality specialist care.

A cerebrovascular accident (CVA), an ischemic stroke or "brain attack," is a sudden loss of brain function resulting from a disruption of the blood supply to a part of the brain. Cerebrovascular accident or stroke is the primary cerebrovascular disorder in the United States.

Cerebrovascular Accident (Stroke) Nursing Care and ...

Ischaemic strokes can often be treated using injections of a medicine called alteplase, which dissolves blood clots and restores blood flow to the brain. This use of "clot-busting" medicine is known as thrombolysis. Alteplase is most effective if started as soon as possible after the stroke occurs - and certainly within 4.5 hours.
