

## Long Term Care In Transition The Regulation Of Nursing Homes

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Background. Long-term care facilities (LTCFs) are often places where persons with complex health needs that cannot be met in a community setting, reside and are cared for until death. However, not all persons experience continuous declines in health and functioning. For some residents who experience improvement in personal abilities and increased independence, transition from the LTCF to the community may be an option.

Care transition, the process of moving from community care to residential care, is one of the biggest changes that older people can experience in their later life. Evidence from the literature suggests that older people's experiences of care transition tend to be negative and traumatic, with most of them being little involved in the process of care transition.

Care transitions between settings are a well-known cause of medical errors. A key component of transition is information exchange, especially in long-term care (LTC). However, LTC is behind other settings in adoption of health information technologies (HIT).

How people are supported during transition can affect their experiences of the process and probably the outcomes. Implications. This leads the authors to develop several implications for social work. Moving to a care home might be better supported by attention to new residents' needs as their care changes and major life events happen. While this may be in short supply the authors cite some US evidence of ways of offering continuity of support in such transitions.

Recommendations for best practices for transitions of care for high risk older adults currently exist in Clinical Practice Guidelines such as Transitions of Care in the Long-Term Care Continuum and Acute Change of Condition in the Long-Term Care Setting (e.g., INTERACT) (American Medical Directors Association (AMDA), 2010; Ouslander et al., 2014), and documents available through the National Transitions of Care Coalition (NTOCC).

All clinicians, whether paediatricians like myself, child and adolescent mental health practitioners, or adult clinicians, working with this age group must recognise the need for a planned and supported transition process for young people with long term health conditions and complex healthcare needs as they move from child centred to adult delivered services and lifestyles.

It is important to have a face-to-face transition planning meeting prior to the agreed upon transition date that includes you, your parents or guardians, your SSC, and a representative from Family Care, IRIS, or your county's long-term support program, who will be working with you as an adult.

2015 recorded delayed transfers of care rose 31 per cent and in 2015 accounted for 1.15 million bed days. For older people in particular, we know that longer stays in hospital can lead to worse health outcomes and can increase their long-term care needs. Wherever possible, people should be . supported to return to their home for assessment.

Care transitions include the coordination of medical and long term services and supports (LTSS) when an individual is: Admitted to a hospital, emergency room, or other for acute medical care Discharged from a hospital to an institutional long-term care (LTC) setting, such as a skilled nursing facility/nursing facility (SNF/NF), inpatient rehabilitation facility (IRF), or intermediate care facility (ICF)
