DIAGNOSIS AND MANAGEMENT OF NEUROPATHIC PAIN

This guideline covers managing neuropathic pain (nerve pain) with pharmacological treatments (drugs) in adults in non-specialist settings. It aims to improve quality of life for people with conditions such as neuralgia, shingles and diabetic neuropathy by reducing pain and promoting increased participation in all aspects of daily living.

Neuropathic pain in adults: pharmacological management in ...

Peripheral neuropathic pain manifests as spontaneous pain (stimulus-independent pain) or pain hypersensitivity elicited by a stimulus after damage to or alterations in sensory neurons (stimulus-evoked pain). Normal neuronal function is contingent on the neuron itself, its supporting glial cells, and the environment with which it interacts.

Neuropathic pain occurs when nerve fibers become damaged, traumatized and/or otherwise dysfunctional. 3 ? To best understand neuropathic pain, let's talk briefly about what nerves do. Their job is to relay messages to and from the brain and spinal cord about what's going on. Nerves are found in tissues, organs, muscles and more.
