It was formed In the year 1985 by the merger of Nabisco Brands and R J Reynolds Tobacco Company. 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The valuation of RJR consists of three steps: 1. develop a set of base-case cash-flow scenarios, 2. derive the appropriate discount rate, 3. discount the cash flows from Step 1 at the cost of capital derived in Step 2; account for the value of existing debt to obtain the value of RJR's equity.
