Individuals with " syndrome X " often experience concomitant sleep-disordered breathing (SDB) which acts synergistically to increase their risk for cardiovascular disease [2, 3]. Thus, some investigators have suggested that " syndrome X " may include SDB and must then be called " syndrome Z " .

Sleep-Disordered Breathing: Beyond Obstructive Sleep Apnea---

Obstructive sleep-disordered breathing is a complex, multifactorial disorder. Adenotonsillar hypertrophy is considered an important factor associated with obstructive sleep apnoea syndrome. Enuresis and obstructive sleep-disordered breathing are both frequent problems of sleep in childhood.

Ventricular arrhythmias have been reported in up to 66% of patients with sleep-disordered breathing. 12 This is very important, as the presence of sustained ventricular tachycardia in heart failure patients correlates with mortality and leads to consideration of implantable cardioverter--defibrillator placement. Additionally, atrial arrhythmias, such as atrial fibrillation and flutter, are common comorbidities found in patients with heart failure.

The severity of sleep-disordered breathing is classified as mild (AHI 5 --<15 events/hour), moderate/severe (AHI 15 events/hour) or severe (30 events/hour) based on the frequency of the events per hour of sleep.18 Patients are defined as having central sleep apnea if 50% of events are central in nature, and obstructive sleep apnea if 50% of events are obstructive in nature.19 The Central Apnea Index (CAI) is commonly utilized to measure the number of central apnea events per hour.
